

GUIDELINES FOR AUTHORS

The Journal of Oral Biosciences is the international and official journal of the Japanese Association for Oral Biology. The Journal publishes the results of original research relevant to the basic and advanced research fields of oral biosciences. The Journal also will publish a supplementary issue for the Proceedings of the Annual Meeting of the Japanese Association for Oral Biology. All submitted manuscripts are peer-reviewed by the editors, members of the editorial board, or scientists in the forefront of oral biosciences worldwide to maintain high standards of publication.

Ethics

Investigations on human subjects and experiments should conform to accepted ethical standards formulated in the Helsinki Declaration of 1964 (revised in 2000, cf. http://www.med.or.jp/wma/helsinki02_j.hym). Fully informed consent should be obtained and noted in the manuscripts. Similarly, the protocol for animal experiments should also comply with the provisions of the Helsinki Declaration and should be approved by an institutional review board.

Instructions for authors

1. The following types of material will be considered for publication : original articles, review articles, articles concerning progress related to methodologies (technical notes) and short communications. The Journal also includes other sections such as an Editorial, Letters to the Editor, Reports, Book Review, Abstracts and News items that may be of interest to oral biologists.
2. Manuscripts should consist of work which has not previously been published in any language, and which is not under consideration for publication elsewhere.
3. All authors who describe experiments on humans or animals are required to provide assurance in the manuscript that the appropriate standard for human or animal experiments have been followed, and that the experiment has been reviewed and approved by their institution's ethics review committee. The institutional permission should be mentioned in the manuscript.
4. Manuscripts should be written in clear, grammatical English and authors who are not native speakers of English have to have their manuscript corrected by a native English speaker before submission.
5. Papers should conform strictly to Journal style. Manuscripts in English should be double-spaced on one side only of A4 paper, with typescript in font size 12. For computer-assisted printers, a common font such as Courier is recommended (3 typewritten pages correspond to approximately 1 printed page). Each paper must have margins of not less than 2.5 cm on each side and 3 cm at the top and bottom of each sheet. One manuscript should be limited to 10 printed pages including tables and figures.
6. The manuscript should be presented in the following order : (1) title page, (2) abstract and key words, (3) text, (4) acknowledgements, (5) references, (6) figure legends, (7) tables (each table complete with the title and footnotes on a separate page), and (8) figures.
7. The title pages should contain all of the following information : (1) the category of the manuscript (original article, review article, technical note or short communication) (2) the title of the article, (3) the full name(s) of author(s) and the addresses of the institutions at which the work was carried out, (4) the full name of the corresponding author and e-mail address, (5) a short running title within 60 letters including spaces and (6) the field (anatomy, histology, biochemistry, pharmacology, microbiology, physiology, or pathology) under which the submission should be reviewed.
8. The abstract must be as brief as full documentation allows. It should state the subject, new findings and conclusions of the article in generally

intelligible terms. It should be no longer than 250 words. Up to five key words (lowercase) should be provided to assist with the indexing of the article. Approved words from the Medical Subject Headings (MESH) database are available at : <http://www.nlm.nih.gov/mesh/MBrowser.html>

9. The text should consist of : (1) Introductory section, conveying the background and purpose of the reports, (2) Materials and Methods, (3) Results, and (4) Discussion.
10. Names of chemical compounds should conform to the International Union for Pure and Applied Chemistry (IUPAC) nomenclature and biochemical terms to those of the International Union of Biochemistry (IUB). All units of measurement should be SI units in international usage. Omit periods after units of measurements or abbreviations.
11. The source of financial grants and the contribution of colleagues or institutions should be acknowledged in "Acknowledgements."
12. In the text, references must be cited using superscript Arabic numerals in the order in which they appear. Once a reference is cited, all subsequent citations should be according to the original number. The titles of journals should be abbreviated according to the listings given in 'List of Journals Indexed' by Index Medicus.
 - 1) Journals : all authors' names : title. Journal name, volume number (bold) : first and last pages, year of publication.
Example) Liljemark, W. F. and Schauer, S. V. : Competitive binding of oral streptococci to hydroxyapatite. *J. Dent. Res.* **56** : 157—165, 1977.
 - 2) Books : all authors' name : full title of the chapter. title of book. (editor's name), first and last pages of the chapter, name and domicile of publishers, year of publication.
Example) Yamada, S. : 45Ca kinetics and balance study. A useful method for analyzing the effects of drugs on calcium metabolism. In : *Pharmacological approach to study of the formation and the resorption mechanism of hard tissues.* (ed. Ogura, H.), pp.75—92,

Ishiyaku EuroAmerica, Inc. Tokyo, St. Louis, 1994.

- If the reference cited is in a language other than English and it is an essential citation, the title of it should be translated into English, and the title in the original language should be indicated in parentheses. However, the present policy of Journal of Oral Biosciences is to reduce to a minimum the citation of works which are not widely available to the international scientific community.
13. Short communications should be written in English (not exceeding 3 printed pages including figures and tables) and conform strictly to Journal style containing all information as an original article.
 14. Tables should be given with an Arabic numeral on a separate sheet. Each table should have an explanatory title and sufficient experimental detail in a paragraph under the table as a footnote.
 15. Each figure should be given with an Arabic numeral on a separate sheet. Original drawings or high-quality photographs are needed. Where necessary, the orientation of the illustration should be indicated by an arrow and the word "top". The magnification of microphotographs should be indicated in the legends or a bar should be included in the figure to indicate the scale (or both). Illustrations may be submitted in final size or larger for reduction by the printer (figures will be rendered to fit within the type area). Identify all figures in the margin or on the back, with the author's name and figure number. Legends to all figures should be accompanied by a title and an explanatory legend in numerical order on a separate page.
 16. Indicate the desired final sizes of photographs. Figures and photographs will be fitted to either a single column or a double column.

Submission fee and page charge

There are no handling or page charges for publication in the Journal of Oral Biosciences.

Copyright transfer

1. Copyrights of papers accepted for publication shall be reserved by the Japanese Association for Oral Biology and the corresponding author will be asked to sign a Transfer of Copyright form which will be sent to the author.
2. Submission of a manuscript means that the authors automatically agree to assign exclusive copyright license to the Journal of Oral Biosciences if and when the manuscript is accepted for publication.

Submission of manuscripts

Articles for the Journal of Oral Biosciences should be submitted electronically via online submission (<http://ess.jstage.jst.go.jp/contrib/JORALBIOSCI/initialsubmission>)

Permission to reprint materials published in the Journal of Oral Biosciences

Permission must be obtained before reproducing or republishing a paper in another article or on personal

or institutional websites, whether in whole or in part. Fill out the permission sheet (<http://www.jaob.jp/>) and mail it to the office.

Galley proofs and reprint orders

The Journal provides authors with galley and illustration proofs for their examination. The authors should proofread these carefully, but no new items may be inserted in the text at the time of proofreading.

Reprint order forms will be sent to authors along with their proofs. Reprint orders should be placed when the galley proofs are returned. Fifty reprints without covers will be supplied free of charge for members of the Japanese Association for Oral Biology. Orders cannot be cancelled after printing of the Journal has been finalized.
